ABBUC – The ATARI Bit Byter User Club

With about 400 members ABBUC is the worlds largest ATARI 8 Bit computer user club. Under the roof of ABBUC e.V. ('e.V.' means club fulfils all regulations required by German law for being charitable and non-profit) members occupy themselves with hard- and software for a computer system, which started its success in 1979 with the "ATARI 400/800".

The club was founded by ten enthusiasts in 1985 in Herten, Germany. It was shortly thereafter officially registered at the municipal court in Recklinghausen. Within a short timeframe the club gained more and more popularity and was recognized nationwide. Together with the German reunification in 1989 the popularity once more increased and reached its peak in 1991 at 871 members. Today members, users and fans come from all over the world.

Over the years the home computers vanished and made way to the Personal Computer, but the fascination for the "little" ATARIs survived and became an established hobby. Under the cunning and clever management of the president of the club, Wolfgang Burger, the club evolved to what it is today: a user club to participate.

In 2015 the club celebrated its 30th anniversary! A seemingly short lived home computer system of the early 80's still has its faithful fans, for whom the ABBUC club is the point of reference.

Regional and International

Many regional groups represent the ABBUC in Germany. Numerous contacts provide the supply of the members with information, hard- and software. Connections are established and are cultivated not only to states in the European Union but also overseas like the USA, UK, Japan and Israel.

To encourage international contacts and to open the possibility to join in, the website of the ABBUC (http://www.abbuc.de) is maintained in German and English language.

Portfolio – products and services for members

- Four times a year a disk-magazine with 5,25" diskette and printed supplement is sent to our members
- every year up to two special editions with software or books are sent to our members

- In the members area on the webpage exclusive content is to be found. All the old magazines can be downloaded from there.
- Experts for computer hardware and disk drives are at hand if something fails and needs repair.
